Don't Mix MS Exchange & MS Outlook 97

Microsoft warns users that have installed its Exchange messaging client to not deploy Outlook 97 on the same system units.

The combination can bring network and application performance to a crawl. The Outlook 97 client overwrites system registry entries that are also used by Exchange, thereby causing a conflict. If users attempt to return to Exchange, Outlook must also be open for access to forms such as new mail messages and schedule screens.

Outlook 97, which ships with Microsoft Office 97, is intended to replace Exchange; however, many companies have standardized on Exchange as a messaging system and not all stations are upgraded to Office 97.

Microsoft has released a beta utility, Forms Fix, which allows users to automatically switch between the two programs without impacting system or network performance. The utility is available on Microsoft's website, <http://www.microsoft.com/>.

Share Your Printer

Hewlett-Packard Co. next week will introduce a print server designed to allow shared access to printers within to small businesses and workgroups.

The \$199 (list price) HP JetDirect 150X print server does not require a file server or PC for its network services. It connects directly as a network node, which makes it useful for NetWare and Windows 95 networks.

The print server allows two-way communications between user and printer, and sends management warnings such as low ink and paper out to the network users. The 150X includes HP's highly-regarded JetAdmin software that allows the printer to be accessed by all network users. Installation requires about 15 minutes.

Faster Chips In DGL Golds

DGL Gold custom-built, super-fast computers will feature the new Cyrix-IBM 6x86MX chip as it becomes available later this summer.

Computer chip maker Cyrix said it will introduce its latest challenge to Intel with a microprocessor that beats the Pentium II in performance and costs half the price. DGL President, Dave Murphy confirmed that the Cyrix chip does not have the same mathematical bugs as the Intel Pentium II and Pentium Pro chips.

Chips ranging from 166 MHz to 266 MHz are expected this year. The 6x86MX chip is fully MMX compatible and offers all the features of the Intel chips, with some extra benefits. The chips run cooler than their competition, thereby increasing the lifespan of the chip.

In lab test at PC Magazine, and confirmed by tests at Damar Group's facility, the Cyrix-IBM chips outperform Intel chips of the same speed rating.

Netscape's newest web browser, Communicator was released this week.

A new high price for a high-profile Internet address was set last week when the domain business.com was sold for \$150,000 to an undisclosed company in Texas. Domain names are currently the hottest selling item on the Internet.
